Developing a tangible financial learning tool


Indigenous Peoples have faced many barriers in pursuing and achieving financial independence and well-being. One of the 94 Calls to Action by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) is to develop culturally appropriate curricula to help Indigenous youth access information and achieve success.

OUR SOLUTION

To teach Indigenous youth in grades 10-12 financial literacy, we have developed a card game to give insight into managing their money in their first year of post secondary.

This is a fun and interactive way for Indigenous students to realistically determine their budgeting while also being presented opportunities they are eligible for.

Each selection is made from a list constructed of real life options using real metrics in Alberta

CHOOSE A SCHOOL

Each player starts the game by selecting which school they wish to attend, each school has differing tuition and costs.

- Norquest College




CHOOSE TO WORK

Each player chooses to either work a minimum wage job.

Minimum Wage Jobs:

- Coffee Shop
- Fast Food Restaurants
- Landscaping
- Retail Store
- Movie Theatre



CHOOSE A FINANCE PLAN

Each player selects a finance plan that will set them up to play their tuition, rent and monthly expenses.

Options:

- Loans
- Grants
- Scholarships
- Savings



CHOOSE YOUR LIVING CONDITION

Each player selects a living condition, which reflects how much they pay in rent each month.

Options:

- Living at Home
- Living on Campus
- Off Campus Renting (Alone)
- Off Campus Renting (Roommates)



MONTHLY EVENT CARDS

There are **monthly specific event cards** that highlight the theme of each month. All players must follow the call to action on the cards. Event cards are actions that either **positively** or **negatively** affect a players budget.

Examples:

GAMEPLAY

- September/January
 - Pay tuition & fees
- November/February
 - Go on a trip for reading break or spring break



GENERAL EVENT CARDS

Event cards are actions that either **positively** or **negatively** affect a players budget. There are general event cards that can be drawn in any month, and then there are event cards that can only be drawn in its respective month.

Examples:

- All months
 - Pick up an extra shift at work
- November February
 - Pipe burst card
